# **CAB: Event Coordinators**

We are hiring for 2 positions!

#### Project Management: "Being Organized"

- o Planning events with lots of moving parts: budget, logistics, themes, marketing.
- o Collaboration
  - > With other student leaders
  - > With other departments and programs
  - > With administration and campus operations/facilities

#### **Outreach: Smiling Faces**

- o Social media and graphic design
- o Tabling and networking

# CAB: Club Coordinators

There are 3 positions currently open! You'll also have an experienced Club Coordinator to help you learn the basics in Fall Quarter.

#### The Social and Mentoring Aspects

- 50% of this position is you mentoring other students! Offering group help with workshops to individualized guidance with orientations/event planning.
- Did you know that participating in Student Life counts as work? We ended Spring quarter with almost 50 clubs on campus who host events such as Hikes, Inter-campus Sports games, workshops, and more! You will be what makes it possible.

#### Level up your Knowledge!

- Club Coordinators will learn a lot of about school and state policies over the year and how they apply to clubs.
- We'll tailor your experience to what your career goals are!

### Information Central: Student Ambassadors

We are hiring for 3 to 4 positions in our student-driven information center

- Often, you are the first point of contact for questions about the college, its policies and procedures, and student resources whether by phone, email, or walk-in
- As an Ambassador, you will develop your leadership qualities and teamwork skills to help guide, troubleshoot problems, and advocate for students and community members while representing the college
- Our collective work enhances the work of all other programs on campus in the service of student success and agency

# M. Rosetta Hunter Art Gallery: Gallery Monitor

We are hiring for 1 to 2 positions in the Art Gallery, 10-12 hours/week Accepting applications as of April 11th

- Monitor the gallery, assisting visitors and keeping headcount
- Support installation and de-installation of exhibitions, including framing, adjusting track lighting and making labels
- Event support for art openings, workshops and all-campus events
- Gallery & office organization and light cleaning
- Interact with student artists and emerging local artists

# ASC: Executives & Associates

### EXECUTIVE OFFICERS:

- 10-12 hours/week
- 6 Positions: Administration, Communications, Finance, Issues & Concerns, Student Success, Legislative Affairs
- Chair committees
- Voting members
- More college governance responsibilities

### ASSOCIATES:

- 8-10 hours/week
- 3 Positions: Administration, Outreach, Finance
- Little more flexibility
- Possible to maintain multiple jobs on campus
- Collaboration and adaptability needed in any ASC role!

\*All students who apply for ASC Executive Officer positions will need to collect <u>25 endorsements</u> from their constituents (student). Endorsement sheets will be emailed to applicants (printed copies will be available in the SL Office).

Endorsements = signatures from continuing students whom you'll continue to inform and engage as an officer in 2024-2025

### Eligibility Requirements

- Must be **currently enrolled** as a student at Seattle Central for Spring 2024
- Must plan to enroll in **at least 10 credits** per quarter throughout the 2024-25 academic year (excluding Summer Quarter)
- Must be able to commit until the **end of the academic year** (until June 2025)
- Must have and maintain at least a 2.5 quarterly/cumulative GPA

- Must be open and eager to work with and serve students of all backgrounds: cultural, ethnic, religious, political, gender, ability, academic pursuits, and all other ways we define our uniqueness

# Application Questions

- 1. Why are you interested in working in Student Leadership? Please list each role that you're applying for and share why you're interested in that particular role.
- 2. Please describe your experience with student life (organizations, clubs, student government) OR describe an experience where you demonstrated leadership skills.
- 3. What unique skills, experiences, and/or knowledge will you bring to your role in Student Leadership?
- 4. What skills, experiences, and/or knowledge do you hope to gain from working in Student Leadership?

# Best Practices for Applications

- o Thoroughly read about each position and program
- o Reflect on WHY you're applying for Student Leadership and specific roles
  - o Make the case for why you're **unique** and why you should be considered
  - o What makes you stand out?
  - o What are your strengths and weaknesses? How would you like to grow?
  - o Pay attention to **word count** in your responses (100-350 recommended)
  - o **Proofread** before you submit
- o Prepare your responses in Word, Google, or anywhere **outside of the app** 
  - Save your responses for future job applications

Keep an eye on your **email** throughout the entire hiring process!

# Best Practices for Interviews - STAR Method

#### o SITUATION

o Set the scene, provide context

o TASK

o Describe the task, problem or challenge and the purpose (what and why) o ACTION

o Explain how you handled the situation or challenge o RESULT

o Talk about the outcomes or results of your efforts
